L2: Simple descriptions in French LO: To understand a simple description of hair and eye colour	I can recognise a picture of someone from a description of their hair and eye colour I know that most adjectives go after the noun in French I know it is common to add 's' to describe a plural noun such as eyes and hair
L3: Describing people in French LO: To create simple descriptive sentences	I can create a sentence, using word cards, to describe hair and eye colour I understand that if the noun is plural, like 'hairs' or 'eyes', then the adjective becomes plural too
L4: Describing personality traits in French LO: To understand simple descriptive sentences	I can understand sentences to describe someone's appearance I know some words that describe personality traits I know how to change most adjectives to describe a girl (or a feminine noun)
