Admission to Reception 2027

If your child was born between 1st September 2021 and 31st August 2022, they are due to start school in September 2026.

Applying for a school place You must apply for a primary/infant school place for your child to start their Reception Year.

- Applications for Reception Year places in September 2026 open on 1 September 2025.
- The national closing date for applications is 15 January 2026.
- The national offer date for on-time Reception Year applications is 16 April 2026.

Free School Meals

As a reminder, from September 2026, all children in England from households receiving Universal Credit will qualify for free school meals, removing the previous £7,400 earning cap.

The free school meals new categories are:

- **Targeted FSM:** For pupils in households receiving Universal Credit with annual net earnings of **£7,400 or less**. This group remains linked to additional support like Pupil Premium.
- **Expanded FSM:** A new category for pupils in families receiving Universal Credit who earn **above £7,400**.



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- **Universal Infant Free School Meals:** Continues as normal for all children in **Reception, Year 1, and Year 2** regardless of benefits.

If you have previously been receiving Free School Meals prior to the change, it will still be necessary for you to re apply for your child to continue to be eligible. To apply please follow the link.

GOOD ATTENDANCE MEANS BEING IN SCHOOL AT LEAST 95% OF THE TIME (180 – 190 DAYS).

There are 175 non-school days per academic year for family time, visits, holidays and shopping.

What the government says about school attendance:

At KS2, pupils who attend school nearly every day in year 6 (with an attendance rate of 95-100%) were 1.3 times more likely to achieve the expected standard in reading, writing and maths, compared to pupils who only attend 90-95% of the time. **This means missing just 10 days of year 6**



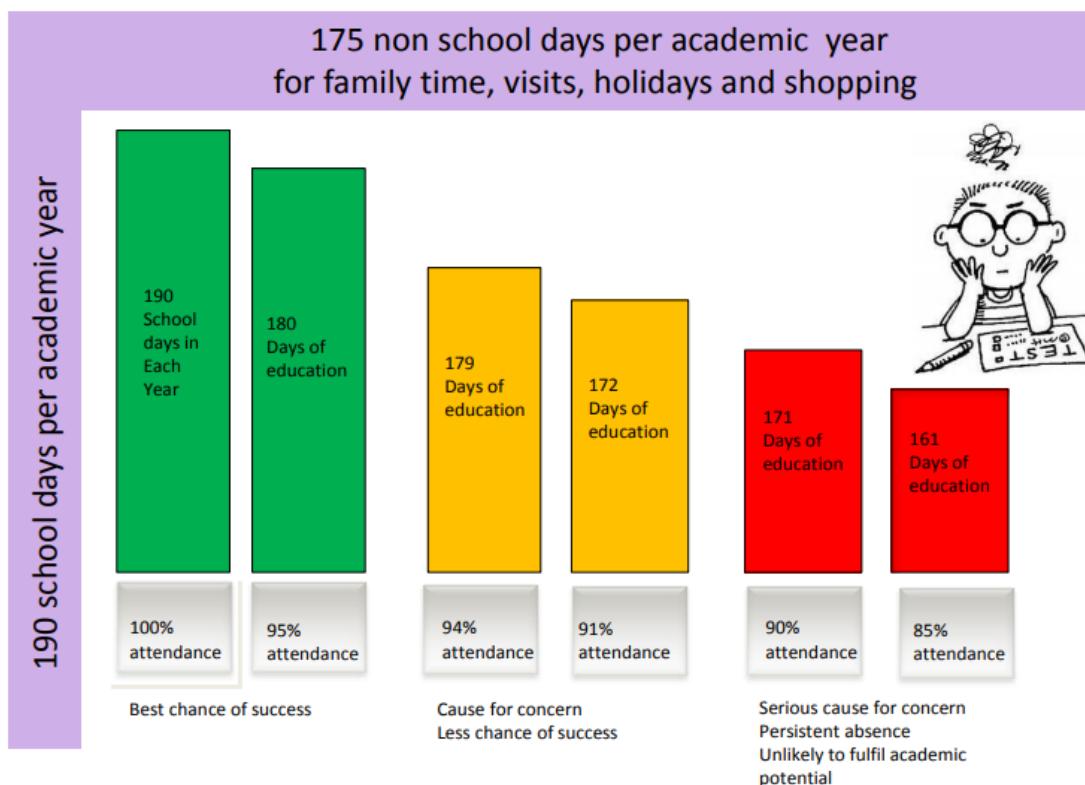
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reduces the likelihood of reaching the expected standard by around 25%.

Pupils who attend everyday are 1.8 times more likely to achieve the standard than persistently absent pupils who only attend 80 – 90% of the time (relating to 4-6 weeks more time in school).
